## ELECTION INFORMATION

**Primary Election** Tuesday after the first Monday in June of even-numbered years

**General Election** Tuesday after the first Monday in November of even-numbered years

**School Board/UNM-LA Election** Tuesday after the first Monday in February of odd-numbered years

### ALL VOTERS

- Must be citizens of the United States.
- Must be 18 years old by the date of the election.
- Must complete their registration 28 days before a scheduled election.
- Must change their registration when they change their name, address or political party affiliation.

**Registration** may be done in person from 8 am to 5 pm weekdays at the County Clerk's office; during business hours at the Motor Vehicle Dept.; and at other places as announced. Registration by mail is possible but additional identification requirements may apply when applicant votes for the first time. Call the County Clerk's office, 662-8010, to receive a registration form to be mailed back to the Clerk.

**Absentee Voting** is allowed for 40 days in advance of an election. Apply for a ballot in person or by mail at the County Clerk's Office, or vote in person at the County Clerk's Office.

An alternate **Early Voting** site is staffed Tuesday through Saturday between the third Saturday prior to an election and the Saturday prior to the election. This site has later weekday hours than the County Clerk's Office as well as being open on Saturday.

The County Clerk's Office has a wall map showing precinct boundaries. Legal notices published in the Los Alamos Monitor give the voting place for each precinct for each election. Polling places may vary depending on the type of election. Some special elections may be by mail-in ballot only.
